Important Reminder on Darshan	<p><i>“Always find a quiet corner after My darshan. My energy goes from Me as I pass you. If you proceed to talk immediately, the energy received by you is dissipated (wasted) and returns to Me, unused. Rest assured that whatever My eyes see become vitalized and transmitted. Gathering for daily darshans	<p>U.S.A. devotees will meet at designated locations near North Building #8 close to overseas accommodation area or in front of North Buildings 1, 2 and 3 the exact location will be determined based on the size of each group.</p> <p>Devotees are requested to line up separately by gender at designated times for both morning and afternoon Darshans. The exact time will be communicated by Darshan Leaders. (Darshan Leaders are individuals assigned to groups of devotees to assist with the darshan arrangements. There are separate Darshan Leaders for men and women. A Darshan Leader once assigned to a group will not change; i.e. the same individual will interact with his/her group for the entire period).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Designated U.S A. scarves must be worn and Badge displaying Darshan Ids to be worn by devotees for daily darshans. Children under 3 years old may not require a scarf however they would need to wear their Darshan Id Badges. 																		
Male Dress Code	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Men, Young Adult Males and all Boys over 5 years old will be required to wear white button down shirt (preferably long sleeves) and long white pants (trousers). No shorts. 																		
Girls Dress Code	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Girls from SSE story group through Group 3 (ages 5 to 15) are required to wear white with shoulders completely covered and the length of the outfit must be beyond the knee to the ankle.

Darshan Seating	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Seating arrangement will be designated on rotation system. Rotations system will be communicated to devotees by darshan leaders. Physically challenged or Elderly may be provided separate seating depending on availability by ashram convener. 	
During and After Darshans	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Devotees must remain seated after each darshan and disperse from Sai Kulwant hall in an orderly manner only after being indicated by Darshan Leaders.

Items allowed and not allowed into Sai Kulwant Hall	<p><u>Allowed</u></p> <p>Only approach Swami to give him letters or to touch His feet only if He indicates for you to do so.</p> <p>Medicine, money, canteen tickets and a few personal items would be allowed.</p> <p>Water bottles are not allowed except for kidney or heart patients or patients who have recently had surgeries. (They need a doctor's note). The bottle like the ones served on domestic Indian flights may be allowed by it would depend on the discretion of the ashram seva dal.</p> <p>Those with young children may bring a plastic bag with crackers, cookies, wet wipes, one bottle, and a small chew toy that doesn't make noise. Pacifiers and diapers are also allowed.</p> <p><u>Not Allowed:</u></p> <p>Cameras or any kind of electronic items including cell phones.</p> <p>Pencils, Pens, Books, Notepad etc..</p> <p>Large Vibhuti packets.</p> <p>No sharp objects of any kind.</p> <p>Do not engage in public displays of affection.</p>
